1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Open Internet Preser-3 vation Act of 2014".

4 SEC. 2. RESTORATION OF OPEN INTERNET RULES DURING 5 REMANDED PROCEEDINGS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—The rules adopted by the Federal 7 Communications Commission in the Report and Order in 8 the matter of preserving the open Internet and broadband 9 industry practices (FCC 10–201; adopted on December 10 21, 2010) that were vacated by the United States Court 11 of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit in Verizon v. Federal Communications Commission (No. 11–1355; 12 13 decided on January 14, 2014) shall be restored to effect during the period beginning on the date of the enactment 14 15 of this Act and ending on the date when the Commission takes final action in the proceedings remanded to the 16 Commission in that decision. 17

(b) ADJUDICATION AUTHORITY.—After the end of
the period described in subsection (a), the Federal Communications Commission may continue to adjudicate cases
regarding violations of the rules described in such subsection that occurred during such period.
